♦ HISTORY CORNER

From archives of Joan Colbourn – Founder of OVASA

In December 2021 newsletter we published letter dated **March 29, 1972** stating foundation of **Ottawa Valley All Setter Association**. Below is another piece of our history – report to CKC showing that in just 2 years OVASA organized many events promoting Setter breeds.

Dear Mr. Brown,

Today I have been asked to provide some background information for the Canadian Kennel Club regarding the Ottawa Valley All-Setter(Club) Assoc. I have therefore dug into my files and come up with the following.

Before I start I feel that it is necessary for you to know why this club was formed in the first place. It is to fill a need in this area, this geographical area that is, for information pertaining to setters. As you know there are, or have been active clubs in the individual breeds. Unfortunately, in the case of the Irish Setter Club of Canada its base is in and around Toronto and it is virtually impossible for those of us between 250 and 300 miles from their meetings to take advantage of those meetings. The same sort of situation exists here in the Ottawa Valley for the other two setter breeds. The English Setter Club is not active in this area, nor is the Gordon Setter club. This is partly because of the numbers of dogs of these three breeds that are in this area. In conversation with breeders and owners of these three breeds we found that collectively we felt we could offer something to the three separate breeds. Hence, the formation of a new club to act as a source of information and education for those involved in these breeds, ie: The Ottawa Valley All-Setter Club.

The talking about this started in 1971 and earlier.

1972: March 29. 29 setter owners and breeders got together to decide ~~how many~~ what kind of an organization should be formed, and what kind of a code of ethics should be incorporated into the membership requirements.

Those involved in the original organization are : Mr. & Mrs. Alan & Thora Brown, (Varandus Reg'd), Major & Mrs. Hampton, Woodlawn, Ont., Micheline Tremblay, Dick & Joan McCarthy, Joan & Ken Colbourn, (Fallowfield Reg'd.), Jan & Don Craig, (Bryjade Knl), Betty MacDonald, Mickey Reynolds, Dorothy & Bert Langman (Robingreen Knl.), Audrey Larsen (Cedarwood Knl), Linda Scattergood, Margaret & Tom Bocking (Grianan Knl), Ulla Stenerson, Wendy & Bob Bond (Fernleigh Reg'd.).

In this first year we had 47 members, which included such people as Bill McClure (Kippewa Kennel), Ted Gundersen (Judge), Alan Fournier, and on to the 47th name. We have lists available should you require them. The members come primarily from the Ottawa valley, but there are a few interested breeders and owners from as far away as Milton, Ontario and Montreal (which isn't too, too far away) who wished to join and so did.

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Winter 1972: we held a series of show handling classes--15 to 20 dogs came with owners.

Demonstration of Grooming and trimming for shows.

Sept 7: General meeting with Fun Match in Morrisburg, Ont. 50 people 35 dog present

Nov. 72: Booster Show at OKC show, Ottawa.

1973:

Series of handling classes during winter.

Field training venture started and worked on by those interested in it.

Birds purchased and used for training available for any of the members who are interested.

Field talk by those from Ottawa Gun Dog Club ~~WIXX~~.

Movie of pointing dogs, training tips and invitations which were taken up on for new people to work along with old hands in the field game.

Movie of parasites.

Movie of ~~XXXX~~ Training and selection of new puppy, and its start in life.

Review of field dogs by experienced gun dog man--Bill McClure.

Sept. 30 1973: Robingreen Fram, Dunrobin, Ontario. 60 people, 40 dogs.

1974:

Members this year tried out their new field dogs with the Field Trials hereabouts.

Series of handling classes during winter.

Booster in connection with May Ottawa Kennel Club Show.

Fun Match, Ottawa University, Sept. 29. It Rained and so we just had a smaller entry than otherwise--around 30 dogs and 40 people.

This year we have an educational program which is to be ongoing and extremely useful to breeder and field and/or show enthusiast.

Spring-- Dr. Q.N. LaHam --talk (illustrated with a skeleton of a dog) on the skeletal anatomy of the dog--Ottawa University dean of Biology.

Fall -- Dr

Fall -- Dr. R. Pukay -- Ottawa Veterinary Hospital -- illustrated talk on the musculature of the Dog.

1975:

January 8 -- Mrs. Rachele Page Elliott is due to give us her illustrated talk on the Movement of the Dog.

All -in-all the organization is thriving and we have approximately 50 members at this time. We have found that with some of our members taking part in the course in Pure-Bred dogs being given at Algonquin College and some being members of the OKC that we are now concentrating on having an informative newsletter for the members to read at their leisure as well as our meetings every second month. With this they can pick up additional information on some of the new research and other developments in the Dog world.

In the future we hope to set up an information bank on the particulars of dogs that we own. Hopefully, in some not too distant future we can set up a genetic information bank which will be useful for future breeders. We also, hope to set up a stud information service about the dogs available in our areas. Hopefully, we can do some public education in the future also.

This information gives you an idea of our active organization. With meetings every second month and a newsletter during the off-meeting month we have good ~~xxxx~~ contact with our members who are eager to find all they can about setters.

After a few years of sanction matches, still freshly organized OVASA held its first Setter specialty in 1975. Our specialty is now known for its reputation as an international class show attracting dogs from all over Canada and USA.

First permanent trophy "Killane Rogue Memorial Trophy" was donated by John Royston of Killane Kennels ...Irish Setters in Meadowvale, near Toronto. Trophy had been won by Ch Killane Rogue....the dog in the photo. In 1979 Canadian Dog Fancier published Joan's article about John. The Canadian Dog Fancier was published here in Ottawa and lasted for a limited time...until the Editor Dennis Mountney, moved to California. (They misspelled Joan's last name :))

Though his name is no longer known to most club members he was a significant contributor to our history.

John and Muriel Royston Profiles

JOAN COULBOURN

THE GOOD OLD TIMES AND THE GOOD OLD-TIMERS!



More than three decades ago, John and Muriel Royston acquired Pat and Mike. Not very novel names for a couple of Irish Setters, but the dogs were a couple of clowns and the Roystons chuckled as they told me some of the exploits of that pair of rogues.

In the small town north west of Toronto where Muriel and John lived with their two red-heads, the dogs must have been called some very unprintable names. Typically canny Irish, they frolicked through the town

under the assumption that it was made only for them.

There is the tale about the youngster who was pulling a little wagon-load of groceries home from his last stop — the butcher shop. He arrived at his destination only to find some of the meat had mysteriously disappeared somewhere along the way. Not surprisingly, it turned up on the lawn of the Royston's home where Pat and Mike finished it off.

There was the time when a neighbor went out to fetch his turkey from the open porch only to find it had somehow flown away in the jaws of a setter:

Those were the days when humorous things like these happened and kids and dogs played together in the neighborhood. Friends and neighbors accepted kids and dogs for what they were . . . unpredictable and sometimes naughty. People in general looked for the good things in life; pleasure in seeing youngsters enjoying themselves was appreciated, and one didn't mind their hollering or breaking the occasional window. Dogs were viewed the same way, they were pleasurable animals to have around and one accepted their idiosyncracies.

A local veterinarian suggested one day that John try showing his dogs. He did, and encouraged further by others, including Bob Blyth of Labrador Retriever fame, and by the fact that he found he enjoyed it, John continued to show them. As with so many

others, he was now bitten by the bug and couldn't turn back.

John became a dedicated "sportsman" in and around the dog show rings, and, at this time, the Killane kennel came into being. Characteristically, John always accepts people as they are.

The Roystons always made one feel welcome. Many a time I sat in their large country kitchen in what is now called Mississauga, with a cool drink in hand, and talked for hours about dogs. We might have been exclaiming over puppies, or discussing the fine points of a particular dog.

Killane dogs were always breeder-owner handled until the advancing years caught up with John's feet. Then Bob Gilham stepped in where John couldn't. This was a turning point, for, as John said, "Dog shows just aren't the same when you can't take your own dog into the ring." Nevertheless, Muriel and John kept on breeding their fine Irish Setters.

The high regard in which the Roystons are held by the Setter fraternity is exemplified in the Ch. Killane Rogue Memorial Trophy which is the Best in Show trophy given each year at the Ottawa Valley All-Setter Association Specialty Show.

Earlier this year, Muriel passed away and John now lives alone in his home in Simcoe with his lovely Irish Setter bitch — home-bred, of course. In his quietly assertive way, John says, "Dog shows have changed so much! Do you remember that Group One booster we had at Ashbury College in the early sixties? There were nine setters entered and we thought that was a fantastic entry. Those shows were relaxed and friendly, weren't they? And you got to know people then. They didn't dash to the show, show their dogs, and dash home like they do now."

Most things change. With luck, though, we dog fanciers will have John and others like him always involved in the wonderful world of dogs and dog showing. 🐾

♦ DOWN THE MEMORY LANE: OVASA first dog shows

At the beginning of OVASA we recognised only the three breeds as the Red & White was not part of the approved listing from the CKC. The run up to being able to hold a CKC sanctioned specialty was to hold at least three sanction matches using the CKC rules.

Our membership included Mr. WD (Sandy) Gunn who at that time had Gordon Setters, later to switch to English Pointers. Sandy worked at Ottawa University so he made arrangements for us to use an external area that was covered in case of inclement weather.

We now needed a judge, Dr. Quentin LaHam worked at Ottawa U and was a specialist in canine structure, and in fact he had the skeleton of one of his German Shepherds assembled in his office. He was starting his judging career and happily agreed to judge the three Setter breeds.

It must have been the summer of 1975 when we set up a ring one Sunday, took entries, made up judging sheets, conned someone to act as ring steward and had a great first event in a long list of specialties, sanction and fun matches which have been held under the OVASA banner.

The following pictures I took of Vicky showing Meagan (our second female) with Quentin LaHam as the judge, please note the bell-bottom jeans/pants they are both wearing.

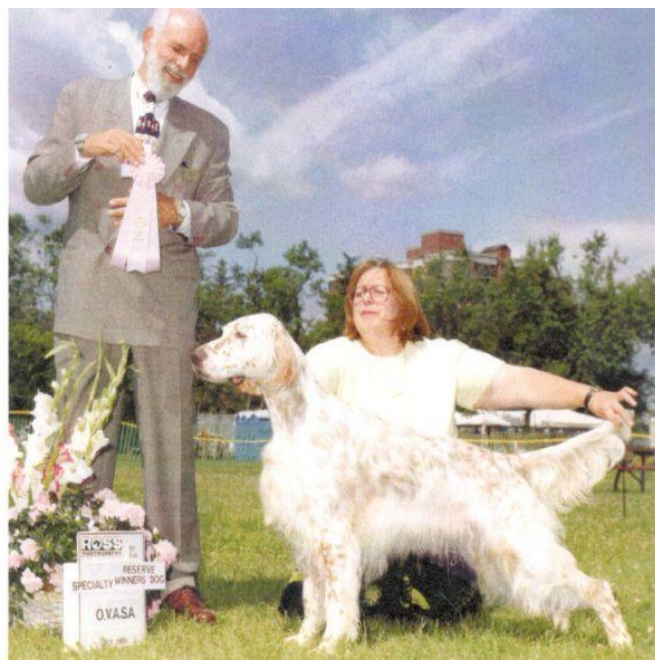

My name is Barbara Hollingworth, and I have been animal crazy all my life. As a young girl growing up in Westmount in Montreal we wanted a dog desperately, and my father finally agreed and Shandy, an Irish Setter, joined our family when I was 10. At that time, people in Westmount just let their dogs run loose and the Westmount police knew who owned which dog, so, if your dog did wander off, he was usually returned in a short time. I had 2 paper routes, the Montreal Gazette at 5:30 in the morning and the Montreal Star after school. Both were in Upper Westmount on the mountain. Shandy was my trusted companion and accompanied me on both paper routes. I used a wagon for the afternoon delivery, and, when I was done, I would tie him to the wagon and he would gallop along Westmount Boulevard with my wagon in tow, all the way home. Now Shandy was a typical Irish Setter and was always getting up to some mischief, as any Irish owner knows. My father was driving us (3 sisters) to Westmount Park, and Shandy was in the car. 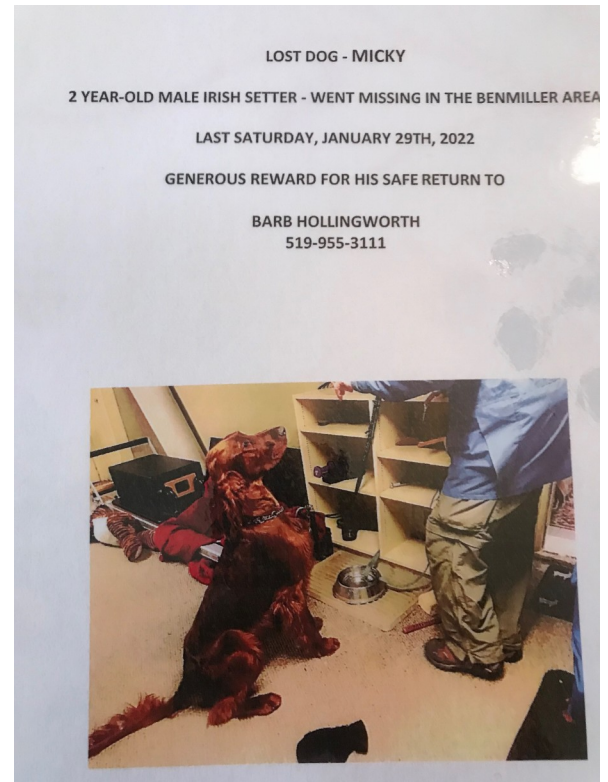

♦ HEALTH ALERTS

CHIC FOR SETTERS

The OFA created the Canine Health Information Center (CHIC) by partnering with participating parent clubs to research and maintain information on the health issues prevalent in specific breeds. OFA established a recommended protocol for breed-specific health screenings. Dogs tested in accordance with that protocol are recognized with a CHIC number and certification.

For CHIC certification, all results **do not need to be normal, but they must all be in the public domain** so that responsible breeders can make more informed breeding decisions. For potential puppy buyers, CHIC certification is a good indicator the breeder responsibly factors good health into their selection criteria. The breed specific list represents the basic health screening recommendations. It is not all encompassing. There may be other health screening tests appropriate for each breed. And, there may be other health concerns for which there is no commonly accepted screening protocol available.

In addition to the breed specific requirements, a CHIC requirement across all participating breeds is that the dog must be permanently identified via microchip or tattoo in order to qualify for a CHIC number.

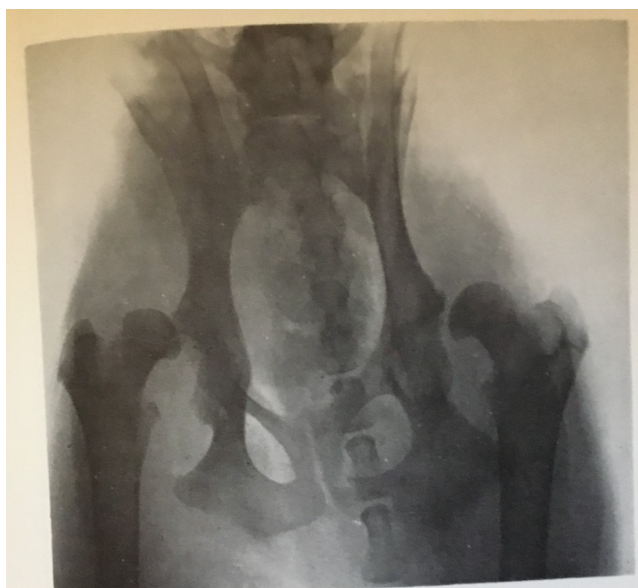
